



Winterline Global Education Prescription Medication Guidelines

The misuse/abuse of prescription medication while participating in the program is prohibited.

1. Prescription medication must be prescribed for current use - and within the past 12 months - for the participant in possession of the medication
2. Prescription medication & diagnosis must be included by the home provider on the medical history form
3. Prescription medication may not be obtained in any country visited unless the medication is needed in an emergency; if so, the participant must report the situation to a Field Advisor immediately
4. Prescription medications are limited to a supply not to exceed the length of the program
5. Prescription medications must be kept in their original containers and must be taken in accordance with dosage recommendations and usage cautions
6. A participant taking prescription medications is personally responsible for ensuring that while taking such drugs, he/she is not a safety risk to themselves or to others
7. The Program reserves the right to consult with medical advisors to determine if a drug or medication, whether prescribed or not, produces hazardous or unsafe effects, and may restrict the use of any such drug or medication accordingly during the participant's tenure in the Program
8. Students must take their medication as prescribed and may not alter their dosage without physician supervision.
9. Students who are prescribed medical marijuana are not allowed to use this prescription on a Winterline Program because it is be illegal to transport it across state and international lines.
